

**DUBOIS RIFLE & PISTOL CLUB**  
**GENERAL RULES**  
**SAFETY FIRST**

1. The DuBois Rifle and Pistol Club functions on the Honor System. This is your club. Respect it and do your part to take care of it.
2. The use of foul language and profanity on the premises is prohibited. Please respect others. The club strives to maintain a family atmosphere.
3. DRPC is a drug, alcohol and smoke free facility. Handling of firearms by persons under the influence of drugs or alcohol is prohibited at all times.
4. Monthly meetings are held the second Wednesday of the month at 7:00 P.M. While the club facility remains available to members all year, no club meetings are scheduled for July and August.
5. Members are expected to attend meetings and to participate in club activities, including maintenance of the facility whenever possible. New members must attend a minimum of one meeting before they will be given the combination to the door lock. Exceptions or alternative requirements will be considered on a case by case basis for those with unavoidable conflicts.
6. Except when participating in a scheduled shooting event, all shooters, including members and their guests, **MUST** sign the logbook when using the range. Time In; Time Out, and Caliber of Firearm(s) must be recorded. Any new problems / damage found with the club facility or equipment (including damage caused by the shooter or his/her guest by accidental discharges, errant shots, etc.) should be written down at this time on a separate sheet of paper, dated & signed, and left with the logbook. Please do not write in the logbook.
7. Guests are limited to two (2) visits, after which they must join the club to continue using the facility. Guests are restricted to shooting air, or .22LR caliber rifles or pistols only. The sponsoring club member is fully responsible for actions of their guests.
8. Club members are to clean up after themselves. The club must be left clean; lights out; exhaust fans off & vents closed; thermostat down and doors locked.
9. The club is not responsible for lost or stolen property. The use of lockers is at member's own risk.
10. Only authorized personnel shall enter the gun storage room.

11. All club owned property must be signed out when it leaves the building. Each member is financially responsible for any club owned property signed out to him or her.
12. To minimize exposure to lead, exhaust fans must be on when the range is in use.
13. Eye & Ear protection must be worn by all shooters and non-shooters on the range.
14. Uncased Firearms are permitted only in designated areas. Designated areas are limited to the Range; the Kitchen and areas specified for Action pistol shoots. **Loaded firearms are permitted on the firing line only.**
15. Targets are to be positioned at the backstop when shooting -- moving targets closer to the firing line is not permitted. Occasional scheduled matches involve firing from closer than 50' and require the presence of a Range Officer (5-8-02). Practice is generally limited to the Fifty Foot (50') Firing Line. Shooters in the learning phase; testing/sighting in, and/or shooting pistols not designed for longer distance accuracy may under certain conditions fire from less than 50', gradually backing up until they achieve the gun performance and handling skills necessary to consistently hit the target from the 50' Firing Line. **Two or more shooters firing from different distances shall NEVER be on the range at the same time.** The first individual shooter to sign the logbook has priority. Those needing to shoot at closer distances are strongly encouraged to choose times when they are the only shooter present. It should be clearly understood that shooters firing from closer than 50' are exposed to greater potential for injury from metal fragments that may ricochet from the bullet trap or metal target hangers, and shooters accept that risk as a condition of being permitted to shoot from less than 50'.
16. All new members must be certified by a Range Officer as safe, responsible and knowledgeable to shoot any permitted firearm on the range. To be Certified, a shooter must successfully complete the Club's required New Member General Orientation, as well as the New Shooter Orientation.
17. As a requirement to fire pistols in the club, pistol shooters must exhibit to the club Secretary or other designated club officer a current Pennsylvania Concealed Carry Weapon Permit, or a Carry Permit issued by a State or Agency having a Reciprocal Agreement with Pennsylvania. New member pistol shooters shall exhibit

the permit upon delivery of application for membership. All pistol shooting members shall exhibit their Carry Permit on or before annual membership renewal dates.

18. Non-Shooters on the range must be behind the White Line (Off the wooden platform). Shooters and their Instructors only are permitted at the Red Firing line.
19. Before anyone goes forward of the Red Firing Line, the Line must be Made Safe. All guns are to be unloaded, on the table, pointed down range, magazines out, slides back, and cylinders open. All persons on the Range will be behind the White Line (Off the wooden platform), and no firearms will be handled when anyone is down range or forward of the Red Firing Line.
20. The Bowling Pins on the range are for scheduled match use only. In Bowling Pin Matches, pins will be shot from the designated line. The Match Director and Range Officers for Action Pistol will give instruction for each scenario. The wood frame target hangers are for air, and .22 LR caliber rifle only, and are not to be used for pistol shooting.
21. The use of Fully Automatic weapons in the club is prohibited, even if the owner is properly licensed for automatic firearms (2-14-01).
22. The only rifles permitted are air rifles, or .22 LR caliber. Rifles chambered for common pistol calibers (i.e., 9mm) are not permitted.
23. Magnum loads are prohibited (.17; .22; .357; .44; .460, etc.), as are the heavy, high performance calibers such as the .500s, .454 Casull, etc. that are not labeled magnum. Cast lead, Sinterfire powdered metal ammunition, Berry's and Rainier Ballistics Leadsafe plated bullets are recommended; however, factory ammunition may be used. If you have a .38spl./357 magnum revolver, you may use it in the range; however, only with .38 special ammunition. These restrictions are not "all inclusive". If you're not sure, check with a club Range Officer.
24. Shooters firing handguns and other shooters firing rifles from the prone position shall not shoot on the range at the same time. The first individual shooter to sign the logbook has priority.
25. Junior Members of the club who are under the age eighteen (18) must be accompanied by an adult member who is over the age of twenty-one (21) while shooting. If the Junior Member is firing a handgun, the accompanying adult member must have a Concealed Carry Weapon Permit on file with the Club.

26. Range Fees: Pistol League participants shall pay \$2.50 per member, per gun per match and \$5.00 per non-member, per gun, per match. The Green Mountain League has been exempted from the above fee schedule by a vote of the members (2-14-01).
